





Dear Members,

It is our pleasure to invite you to the 81st Annual Meeting of High West Energy, Inc. on Thursday, June 21, 2018, at our headquarters in Pine Bluffs, Wyoming (6270 County Road 212). The annual meeting is a time for members to celebrate the cooperative way of doing business, enjoy good food, entertainment, and conduct the important business of the Cooperative.

We are blessed to live and work in exciting times. New developments are rapidly changing the electric industry, and when great employees and great technology meet, incredible things become possible. Moving forward, innovative implementation of these technologies will continue to shift the way your cooperative does business, allowing us to work smarter and offer more to our members, all while reducing long-term operational costs.

In 2016, we invested almost \$5,000,000 in the Co-op's distribution system to keep pace and prepare for anticipated future electric demand. Teams across HWE's four operating

districts constructed or rebuilt almost 56 miles of line (out of 3,679). Additionally, we replaced another 750 poles (we own approximately 75,000) and performed preventative maintenance on our line devices (breakers, regulators, reclosers, etc.). These efforts will result in better power reliability and reduce weather-related outages.

In addition to making system improvements, your cooperative was extremely involved and committed to the communities we serve by donating our time, talents, and monetary contributions in a wide variety of areas. As you will see in the following pages, the investments we made were not just centered around poles and wires. Just like you, our Co-op employees live, work, and play in these communities. This makes you our neighbors and friends, not just a customer in a distant city. We take great pride in that fact and work even harder to ensure High West Energy remains a community oriented business.

We had a great number of other accomplishments throughout the year. We concluded the year financially strong with operating revenues of \$44,617,187 and met our equity management goals. Our net margins, which include a profit generated by our subsidiary (dba High West Wiring and High West Digital Solutions), were \$2,970,405.

You will see throughout this report that each and every one of us at HWE has a role in serving you. Thank you for your membership in our Cooperative. We look forward to another year of fulfilling our mission of the High West companies to serve our members and communities by providing safe, reliable and competitively priced energy and services.

2017 Annual Meeting Minutes

High West Energy, Inc. 2017 Annual Meeting Minutes Pine Bluffs, WY | June 22, 2017

The 80th Annual Meeting of the members of High West Energy, Inc., was held at High West Energy's headquarters in Pine Bluffs, WY at 6:30 p.m., Thursday, June 22, 2017. Following registration, dinner, and a craft show, the meeting was called to order by President Ed Prosser. President Prosser welcomed everyone in attendance and recognized current and retired board members, employees, veterans, special guests, and invited speakers.

The invocation was given by Dave Crouse, CIO of High West Energy.

The reading of the 2017 Notice of Annual Meeting was given by Hank Bailey, Attorney at Law and General Counsel for High West Energy, Inc., whose firm has represented the cooperative for 39 years. It was determined that a quorum was present and that the business of the meeting could move forward. It was moved, seconded and unanimously approved to dispense with the reading of the 2016 annual meeting minutes.

ELECTIONS

Hank Bailey presided over the election. The business of the meeting was to take action upon the following matter: The Nominating Committee submitted the names Gary Smith and James Taylor from District 12, and Dan Acheson from District 15, as nominees for three-year terms.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Prosser gave the history of 80 years of service beginning in 1936 when the possibility of starting an electric cooperative was being discussed and organized and ultimately incorporated on January 28, 1937, as the Rural Electric Company. Financing was obtained in 1939. The first construction contract was issued in 1939 and on May 11, 1940 we were officially energized and offering services. He noted that High West Energy not only has survived for 80 years but continues to thrive, getting better every year.

CEO'S REPORT

CEO/General Manager Brian Heithoff recognized and thanked the Board of Directors and employees and welcomed everyone to the 2017 Annual Meeting, celebrating 80 years as an electric co-op. He reported on the financial

condition of the cooperative which remains in good shape and approved by the auditors. He announced a 10% increase in energy sales from 2015, a 27% increase in High West Wiring's revenue and a 43% increase in High West Digital Solutions' revenue. He reported on \$109,000,000 in assets, three key strategies: efficiency and effectiveness, reliability and quality, and developing solutions for needs. He spoke of the work and due diligence that took place to identify if broadband was a feasible option for High West Energy and ultimately not being comfortable with the risks, choosing not to go forward with the initiative. He identified upcoming needs: base load and renewable options, younger members, advancing technology and aging infrastructure. He reviewed the network of the 900 electric coops in the country and reiterated the goal to satisfy members by looking at different approaches, ideas, and the best fit for the community, along with delivering the best service possible. He closed by announcing he was looking forward to the next 80 years and making life better for the communities High West Energy serves.

Vision Statement

The vision of the High West companies is to be the trusted partner in the solutions we provide.

YOUTH TOURS

President Prosser recognized Robin Feezer, office manager for WREA, for chaperoning the Youth Tour in Washington, D.C. and introduced Laine Vasko of Pine Bluffs, WY, who attended the tour and spoke about the opportunity she had been awarded. She thanked the board and members for sending her on this amazing trip sponsored by High West.

GUEST SPEAKERS

Joel Bladow, Tri-State G&T senior vice president of transmission, thanked the Board of Directors and Brian Heithoff, CEO/General Manager. He announced that High West Energy is one of the founding members of Tri-State G&T and recognized Director Jerry Burnett who serves on the Tri-State Board. He discussed investments, oil and gas growth and renewable energy. He highlighted events of the past year including inefficient power plants they had closed, a rate increase, and significant investments in their transmission system. He reported future challenges include joining an organized market, better direction for member services resulting in better reliability and affordability, cyber security, physical security, and regulatory changes.

Shawn Taylor, executive director of WREA spoke about the Youth Tour interview and selection process. He congratulated High West Energy on 80 years of business and commented on how remarkable the evolution has been throughout the decades. He discussed bills that passed in the Wyoming legislature, and ones that did not.

ELECTION RESULTS

The election committee counted all ballots for Districts 12 and 15. Hank Bailey announced that Gary Smith and Dan Acheson were re-elected for three-year terms.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

There was no unfinished business.

NEW BUSINESS & GENERAL DISCUSSION

There was no new business.

President Prosser adjourned the meeting at 7:34 p.m. There was a motion and a second. All were in favor. Meeting adjourned.

MISCELLANEOUS

Prizes were drawn and announced. There was no unfinished business. The member's name that was drawn


randomly for the progressive jackpot was not in attendance so the amount in 2018 will be \$1,100.



ARTICLE II - MEETINGS OF MEMBERS

Section 5. Voting.

Except as provided in Article III, Section 3, when there is a single nominee, the election of directors shall be by ballot on which each member shall vote the name of such person as is to be elected from the member's district and in balloting for directors each member shall only have the right to cast one (1) vote, from the list of nominees, for the director of their choice from their district.

ARTICLE III - DIRECTORS

Section 3. Nominations.

Notwithstanding anything in this section contained, failure to comply with any of the provisions of this section shall not affect in any manner whatsoever the validity of any election of directors. **Moreover, if there is no more than one nominee for any one district, there shall be no ballot mailed and no vote taken on the nominee for that district, and he or she shall be deemed elected by acclamation.**






